
Here is the Young carers policy I, Lucy Bennet, Daniel Murphy, And Anaya Hilton made 4 months ago

Young Carer's Policy - St Ambrose 2016

What is a young Carer? A young carer is any person under the age of 18 (but over 5) who is either the primary or secondary carer for a person who suffers from: mental health issues, physical disability, addiction or drug abuse



issues. Any unidentified young carers fit into the same criteria only they haven't been recognised by a local young cares service, organisation or charity. There's an estimated 2500-3000 unidentified young carers in Salford alone
